1. Simple Past Tense

- a. Before beginning the lesson from the book, ask your student, "What did you do when you were a child?" [answers might include "I played with my friends. I went to school. I lived in ..." etc.
- b. After the lesson
 - i. Ask your student to tell a story about the pictures in Box 59.
 - ii. Cut up the 5 parts of Box 60. Ask your student to tell a story about this couple and put the pictures in the right order to illustrate it (there is more than one way to arrange them).
- c. For a high beginner student, introduce "used to" to replace the simple past.
 - i. Note that "used to" always refers to past actions/states that are no longer true. E.g., "John used to work in New York, but now he works in Boston."
 - ii. Pronounce it "yusta"
 - iii. Ask the student what s/he used to be able to do as a child that s/he cannot do now.
 - iv. Ask the student how people used to travel.
 - v. Mention *only if the student is or may be confused* that there is another "used to" that means "for the purpose of."
 - 1. E.g., This key is used to unlock the back door.
 - 2. Pronounce it "yoozd to" to show the difference from past tense


2. Present Progressive/Continuous Tense


- a. Before beginning the lesson from the book, ask your student, "What do you think your husband/wife/boss is doing right now?"
- b. After the lesson, ask your student to describe what is happening in the pictures in box 57.
- c. Note that you can use the same pictures for the **past progressive tense** by saying that the picture shows events yesterday and asking what was happening then.

3. Simple Future Tense

- a. Before beginning the lesson from the book, ask your student, "Imagine what you will be doing 5 years from now."
- b. After the lesson, if you have not covered "be going to" for events in the near future, give your student some examples:
 - i. This weekend I will drive to New York to visit my sister. This weekend I am going to drive ...
 - ii. Tomorrow he'll bring his umbrella because the weatherman is predicting rain. Tomorrow he is going to bring his ...
 - iii. Thursday we will have a staff meeting. Thursday we are going to have ...
- c. Ask your student to choose 2 pictures from Box 28 and tell you what is going to happen to these people. Note that you can review **present progressive/continuous** by asking first what is happening in the picture and then what will happen.


