Big Idea

- "Business is about determining what to do and how to get it done." John Reed, November 15, 2004, Address to Sloan community
- Separating <u>analysis</u> from <u>management</u>
 - What to do, and how to do it...
- Our worry is that without separating them, neither is done well

What to Do, How to Do

- What to do...For many situations, necessary, not sufficient
- "How to do it" complements, does not substitute for "what to do"
- We believe in strong analysis
 - "No substitute for getting the analysis right…"
- We are analytical about "How to do it"
 - Research driven
 - Not looking to increase the practitioners

Good for Sloan
