

Conditions for learning

- Many iterations
- Within the learner's control
- Outcome, performance, or other feedback
- Explicit criteria, expectations, prior beliefs
- Ways to test, probe, examine
- Meaningful
- Safety—psychological, physical
- Time to process
- Guidance for convergence




